

Right TO HEALTH

Did you know... ?

- Extreme poverty, hunger, droughts, the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic and the climate crisis seriously affect the health of women, children and elder people in Mali, South Sudan, Congo, and Haiti.
- 40% of minors and 65% of women and girls do not have access to health care in Haiti.
- In South Sudan 4 out of 5 health centers are run by NGOs and depend on the availability of humanitarian funds.
- This reality aggravates gender inequalities: maternal mortality, early pregnancy, sexual and gender violence, etc. And the lack of clean water and sanitation causes frequent cholera outbreaks that do not make headlines in the media.

Cáritas acts by contributing to access to health by means of:

1 Establishing mobile primary care clinics in places whose health centers and hospitals have been destroyed or do not exist.



2 Covering basic medical, emergency, and dental care and support in the purchase of medicines, also for migrants in need (in transit and internally displaced persons).

3 Raising awareness about communicable diseases such as cholera, hygiene, coronavirus, deworming, etc.

4 Purchasing and distributing of latrines, irrigation pumps and water purifiers.



Ongoing projects for 2.500 people:

3 projects to improve health access through specific projects and transversal actions in other projects in Mali, Haiti, and Morocco.
